

- ▶ French is ranked the second most influential language in the world






Learning progression at RVS



Grade 4 (A1.1) - Alphabets, basic Vocabulary - Colours, days, months, Body parts. A student is able to introduce himself in German.


Grade 5 (A1.1) - Professions, Hobbies, sentence structure, framing questions, new verbs. They are able to understand keywords in dialogue discussions and Texts.

French is a Global Language

- 220 million people around the world speak French
- French is spoken in over 50 countries and on 5 continents
- It is the 3rd most frequently used language on the internet
- French is the most frequently taught foreign language after English; the only one to be taught in almost every country in the world



French is Local too

- In the US, French is the second most commonly taught language after Spanish
- French is the 3rd most frequently spoken non-English language in US households.
- French is an official language of Louisiana, and there are important francophone communities in Maine, New Hampshire and Vermont.
- You already know about **15,000** French words (abracadabra, destination, rendezvous) and expressions (RSVP, c'est la vie, voilà) since over **30%** of English vocabulary is borrowed from French.

Some of the loanwords in English taken from French are:

1. **Déjà vu**
 - ▶ a feeling of having already experienced the present situation.
 - ▶ (The word shares the same meaning in both French and English as established before.)
2. **Faux pas**
 - ▶ an embarrassing or tactless act or remark in a social situation.
3. **Avant Garde**
 - ▶ Noun: new and experimental ideas and methods in art, music, or literature.
 - ▶ Adjective: favouring or introducing new and experimental ideas and methods.
4. **À la mode**
 - ▶ This word literally means something that's still in fashion or up to date.

In the same way, certain English words have been adopted in the French language. A few examples are :

1. Le Selfie – A selfie
2. Le Sandwich – A sandwich
3. L'email – An email
4. Cool – Cool
5. Le Dressing – a dressing room
6. Le Footing – Running/jogging
7. Le Week-end – weekend
