It is an educational space meant primarity for children in the age group 8 to 12. The Kinderuni encourages children to look for answers to science related questions on their own and salisly their thirst for knowledge. Here, learning German is combined with an independent and playful pursuit of science. The structure of the digital Kinderuni is similar to that of a university. Students of Kinderuni (children) get to watch videos from three different fields, namely "Humans", Nature" and "Technology", thereby aftending "lectures" at the university. On the completion of each lecture, children are promoted to the next level, for example with titles like Bachelor, Master, <u>Dootfor and so on.</u>

earning progressions show the way forward
